Malarvizhi delivered into the anatomical and endocrinological aspects of ergonomics, providing a comprehensive overview of how ergonomic principles can be applied to dental practice. She explained the importance of posture, the arrangement of dental equipment, and the design of the dental operatory to prevent musculoskeletal disorders, which are common among dental professionals due to prolonged static postures and repetitive motions.

LECTURE ON "KINETICS AND KINEMATICS OF VENTILATION" BY PROF. K. ANAND BABU AT MOTHER THERESA POSTGRADUATE AND RESEARCH INSTITUTE

On Dec 13th, 2023, Prof. K. Anand Babu's presentation delved deeply into the intricate mechanisms and Pathomechanics of ventilation, providing a comprehensive understanding of how breathing processes are influenced under various conditions. He began by explaining the fundamental principles of ventilation, including the movement of air in and out of the lungs, and the forces involved in these processes. His insights covered both the kinetic aspects, which refer to the forces causing the motion, and the kinematic aspects, which describe the motion itself without considering the forces.

A key part of the lecture focused on how ventilation is affected in specific health conditions such as Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and pregnancy. For COPD, Prof. K. Anand Babu discussed the altered biomechanics due to the disease's impact on the respiratory system. highlighting the increased resistance and decreased elastic recoil of the lungs. He illustrated how these changes necessitate greater muscular effort for ventilation. leading to the characteristic symptoms of breathlessness and fatigue.

The session concluded with an interactive discussion, where Prof. K. Anand Babu addressed questions from the participants, further clarifying concepts and discussing their practical implications.


SCIENTIFIC FORUM

The session covered surgical techniques, post-operative care, and the importance of a multidisciplinary approach in patient management.

Mrs. Kanimozhi highlighted recent advancements in prosthetics, including lightweight materials, enhanced mobility designs, smart prosthetics with integrated sensors, and the customization of prostheses using 3D printing. The presentation sparked



significant interest, especially among final year and third-year students, who asked detailed questions about prosthetic types and rehabilitation processes.

Faculty members engaged in a productive discussion, sharing experiences and insights. The event was expertly coordinated by Mr. T. Bharaneedharan, Clinical Incharge, ensuring a smooth and interactive session. - **Student Engagement:** Final-year and third-year students actively participated, asking questions about the anatomical basis and efficacy of the technique, and discussing its integration into clinical practice.
